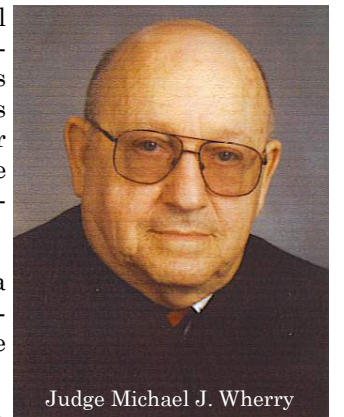

Building Committee Report

On April 18, 2005, GCAHS received a grant from the Pennsylvania Department of Community and Economic Development in the amount of \$9000. The society thanks Sen. Bob Robbins and Rep. Dick Stevenson very, very much for their help in securing the grant. The money was used to cover some of the cost of replacing 17 double hung windows with screens, three large plate glass Low E windows in the library and the trimming of these. We were also able to complete the rear handicapped entrance with sub-flooring and ramp, finish flooring and wall coverings. The total cost of these improvements was \$27,204.32. After the grant money, the balance was paid from donations made to the society, memberships and our savings account. We feel that these were important improvements to our building and are excited to have them completed. John K. Moon Builder was the contractor for this project. There are still seven windows that need installed and trimmed and it would be ideal to have this done before winter. Donations toward this important project would be very much appreciated.

Grove City Area Historical Society (GCAHS) is asking people in their 70s, 80s or beyond who grew up or spent a good part of their lives in the Grove City area to share their memories of what it was like in the first half of the 20th century.

GCAHS has a good collection of historical artifacts. Contributions of memories can complement and greatly enrich these artifacts. The society is looking for memories of daily life, leisure and recreation, work and jobs, school and education, church and religion, and downtown.

The Way We Were Nearing Completion

The Publications Committee of the Grove City Area Historical Society is getting ready to send *The Way We Were* to the printer. The committee has been meeting weekly for more than a year to produce a beautiful hardback book of photos and text. When Society President Tom Armour approached Lillian Reynolds Reeher about this project, she agreed to undertake it, only if she could choose a committee. "That committee has turned out to be the joy to work with I initially anticipated," she said. "They are dedicated to saving the area's history, and are not afraid of hard work. We all have a sense of humor, and that makes the time fly," she added. Members of the committee are all members of the society and include: Armour, Donald Beightol, Willie Caldwell, Ed and Jean Carlson, and John Hummel, in addition to Reeher.

The group have sorted more than 800 photos and come up with about 250 which show various aspects of the community from founding until the 1960s. Most of the pictures have not been published before, and much of the text is fresh and new. Sepia tone photos will add to the book's vintage look.

The text will include inspirational quotes, an index, and a time-line. In addition. Don Beightol, former Public Works Manager and Fire Chief, has researched and mapped local schools and mines. Because Nathan DePew of Earth Sun Moon has offered Curt Hazlett's help with page design, this volume will be especially attractive and one that those who take pride in the area will be very proud to own and to give as gifts.

There is opportunity for patrons to get involved and receive recognition within the book. There is also opportunity for people to memorialize deceased friends and relatives. "Everyone should be eager to help with this project," Dr. Armour said. Grove City is a very special place to live. The efforts of the Publications Committee are directed towards saving all the information that has been given them.

As the book says, "The images in this album are symbols of Grove City as that "good place to live." Whether depicting work or leisure, schools or churches, wars or celebrations, these pictures are about people, the young and the old in our sight, or in our memories. And especially, this book is about those people who before us, worked in and on this community, giving it and us, like the pine tree, roots, diversified branches in balance with each other and the global community, and like those who have come before us, the ability to reach for the sky.

"To all of those who have given all of us the gift of community, and to all of those who have shared their very personal images of it, we dedicate this album and hope you enjoy it as much as we have enjoyed watching it grow."
