

Archiving the Ketler Collection Continues

We are fortunate to be working with the Grove City College Archive Department to continue the project that Jonathan Riddle started a few years ago. The college has provided us with student volunteers to continue cataloging and digitizing the Isaac Ketler papers. Getting a group photo would be a challenge, because they don't all work at the same time. For your information, their schedule for this semester is as follows:

Monday, Rebecca Gale works from 10-1.

Monday and Wednesday from 11:30-1, Eric Peterman.

Monday 2:30-4:30, Eleanor Gray, Zachary Grunder, and Sara Cammenga.

Wednesday 2:30-4:30, Eleanor Gray, Zachary Grunder, and Johnathon Von Stein.

Eleanor is sometimes in on Friday afternoon also, but that depends on the week.

Eleanor Gray (pictured above), the leader of these volunteers explains what they are doing in her message below:

“What we've been working on is a process of cataloging and digitizing the Ketler Collection. (The collection contains many personal and business papers of Isaac C. Ketler and his family.) We are scanning the documents to allow for easier access, and then cataloging them in the Past Perfect computer program so that in the future, researchers can search the database to study specific topics. In terms of progress, with the help of this team we are reaching the end of the first box of uncatalogued correspondence. It's difficult to put that in perspective with the entire Ketler Collection, because some parts of it have been cataloged and others haven't, but the entire collection consists of approximately 25 boxes of papers. It would be completely impossible to make so much meaningful progress without the help and consistency of our team, patiently caring for and digitizing these records. We've also had a lot of supportive help and guidance from Hilary Walczak, the college archivist at Grove City College, and Dr. Thomas Armour, who has helped to get the project back on its feet.”
